Add to home screen for mobile devices.

iPhone


1. Open the app in **Safari**.
2. Look at the bottom of the page, where you will see this **menu**:




2a. If you do not see the bar at the bottom, touch the address bar at the top of the app, to bring the bar up.

3. Click the “Action button” 
4. Select **Add to Home Screen**.
5. Select **Add** on the resulting screen.
6. The app has been added to the home screen.

Android

1. Open the app in Chrome.
2. Look to the right of the address bar, where you will see this: 
3. Click that button, and you’ll see a new menu.
4. Select Add to home screen.
5. If the app name appears in the title, click Add. If you don’t see the app name listed in the title, type it in, and click Add.

If Chrome is not installed on the phone:

1. Open the app in the Android browser.
2. Look to the right of the browser for 
3. Click that, and you’ll see a new menu.
4. Select Save to Bookmarks.
5. If the app name appears in the Label field, move to the next step. If it does not, type it in.
6. From the Add to drop down, select Home Screen.
7. Click OK.
8. The app will be added to home screen*.


*Depending on the version of Android, this may show the app icon or it may show the bookmark icon.

Some older versions of Android don’t have either of these options. In which case, you will need to do the following:

1. Open the app in the browser.
2. Click the bookmark icon to the right of the address bar to add the site to bookmarks.
3. Go to the bookmarks listing.

4. Select and hold the app icon, and a menu will come up.
5. Select add bookmark to home screen.

Blackberry Bold

1. Go to the app in the browser.
2. Press  and select Add to Home screen.
3. Click Add.

Blackberry Q10 & Z10

1. Go to the app in the browser.
2. Click the three dots beside the address bar.
3. Select Add to Home Screen.
4. Select save.

Windows phone

1. Go to the app in IE on the phone.
2. Click the  icon.
3. Press Pin to Start.
